

Health Requirements for 2023 Spring Show:

Pennsylvania Cattle for Exhibition:

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI): Pennsylvania cattle must be accompanied by Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian with an inspection date within thirty (30) days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
- Cattle Identification Requirements: All cattle for exhibition must be identified by an acceptable form of permanent ID. This includes RFID, HAUSA issued tags, or an Official USDA vet issued metal tags called the NUES tags (National Uniform Eartagging System).
- All animals must be free of evidence of infectious & contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI. Animals showing any evidence of contagions, infections or external parasitic disease shall be denied entrance into the show.
- No tuberculosis or brucellosis test is required.
- All animals entering the show should be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV be given within 30 days of the show. In addition, the use of nasal vaccine (Inforce) is strongly encouraged.
- Rabies vaccination is encouraged but not required.
